

Dear Parents

You may be wondering what the passage of Prop 30 means for Walden. Prop 30's passage protects education from a ~\$420-\$515 per average daily attendance (ADA) trigger cut. ADA is the funding Walden receives from the state for every day a student attends our school.

Our school budget is conservative and did not count on passage of Prop 30, but the additional funding will be helpful as we continue recruiting students to increase our ADA to bring it into alignment with our budget.

Each day a student attends is worth approximately \$38 of funding for our school. As I have written previously, you can help

Walden by bringing your student to collect work on days he/she is sick. You can also help by coordinating independent study with your teacher when your student will be away for three or more days. This helps keep your student learning on days away from school, and it helps our school budget.

So far, our ADA for this vear is 98.2%
